Christmas '16 & Vision for the Future

On Sunday, January 1, 2017, we will begin the visioning process for God's next chapter at Kilmarnock Baptist Church. You have been hearing about it for several months, and now we are planning the weekly study groups. The groups will meet at different times and in different people's homes. They will each have a church member leading them. Pastor Carolyn and I will visit different groups.

Everyone will be studying a book called Sailboat Church—Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice by Joan S. Gray (Louisville, KY: Westminster John Knox Press, 2014). The church will order the books for the study group participants. They should cost around \$12 each. For those who want to read the book but do not wish to join a group, The Book Nook in Kilmarnock can order them for you.

During the first ten Sundays of 2017, our worship service will kick-off the chapter for the coming week. So, if you are not in a study group, I would encourage you to buy the book and read along. Better yet—join a group!

Visioning in a Baptist church is a collective effort. By having more members of the church take part, we will develop a vision that better reflects our congregation. If someone chooses not to take part in the process, they will not be able to help develop the vision. God gives each person many gifts. Over the years, I have seen how blessed Kilmarnock Baptist Church is. We have good leaders, talented teachers and thinkers, and hard workers. Each member has much to add to this process.

What does visioning have to do with Christmas? Advent and Christmas are old traditions. For many people, we have celebrated them for many years. Keeping the season fresh and exciting can be a challenge for some people. Likewise, the church has been around for nearly two millennia. What is new? What is different? How can we share the love of Christ in a fresh way?

Visioning is the season when we look at our culture, context, past, present, and dream about our future. Who is God calling Kilmarnock Baptist Church to be? Will the process yield an affirmation of who we are? Or, will we see ways in which we need to change?

Christmas is a reminder of the past: The season evokes childhood memories of parties. Many people are eager for Santa Claus to arrive. We can watch young children's excitement. The music, concerts, parades, and other special events celebrate the season and birth of Christ.

Each year, we might try new things during the season, and we might join traditions that predate our lives. Visioning is a little like this combination of old and new. When we vision for the future, we do not change Christian doctrine; we reexamine who we are as a Christian people in our context. I am excited to be on this journey with you! Greetings from Myanmar! Rainy season is finally over. Thank you again for your prayer and financial support. Please continue to pray for us and support us. Following is our latest ministry update and prayer needs:

Victory Center for Academics (VCA)

Thank God, first semester is done, we celebrated 100th Day on Oct. 26, and we have friends from the US helping us teach at VCA. We will soon celebrate Christmas on Dec. 21. Students are enjoying their time at the school.

Please continue to pray so that we can fit Air conditioners in the classrooms; we need good and strong power supply for that. Once again, please please pray that we can give official announcement regarding partner school before the end of this year to parents. If you know any Bible based church/school that might want to help/work with us, that will be great. As we are nearing the end of the year, we are also praying for rental cost for next academic year.

Water Filter & Humanitarian Aid

Although rainy season is over in Myanmar, time by time we still experience heavy rain due to cyclone in different parts of Myanmar. For the time being, we were not able to provide water purification system. We hope and pray to provide them to the needy people, soon.

Mission & International Church

The mission church I am directing is going well. Our missionaries hold regular worship service for adult and children Sunday school every Sunday. We need your prayer support for our missionaries so that they can win many more souls.

Please continue to pray also for weekend English class and English speaking church in our area. For the time being, I am with my Mizo/Burmese speaking church as assistant pastor. As our senior pastor is out of town for almost 6 months now, i am leading this church.


